And then the hospital gives you a referral to stay at the Altrusa House.

You arrive tired and emotionally spent. And as the door opens, you're greeted by a volunteer who smiles cheerfully and welcomes you to your "home away from home."

You're invited into a lovely home with perhaps the smell of fresh-baked cookies wafting from the kitchen. And after the necessary paperwork is completed the comforting volunteer takes you to a beautifully decorated bedroom where you can retreat and rest.

Would you like to be that welcoming volunteer? I personally began as a volunteer and am now employed part-time at the Altrusa House.

Here are some of the things volunteers do:

- Visiting with and providing support to guests.
- Answering the telephone and door.
- Answering guest questions.
- Cleaning bedrooms at the end of a guest's stay.
- Checking guests in and out.
- Baking treats for all to enjoy

It's not difficult work, but it is oh so rewarding.

Right now the house is in need of more volunteers, especially on weekends. You can volunteer once a week, once a month, once every couple months or as often as you'd like. Thorough training is offered.

A few thoughts from our Altrusa Club president...

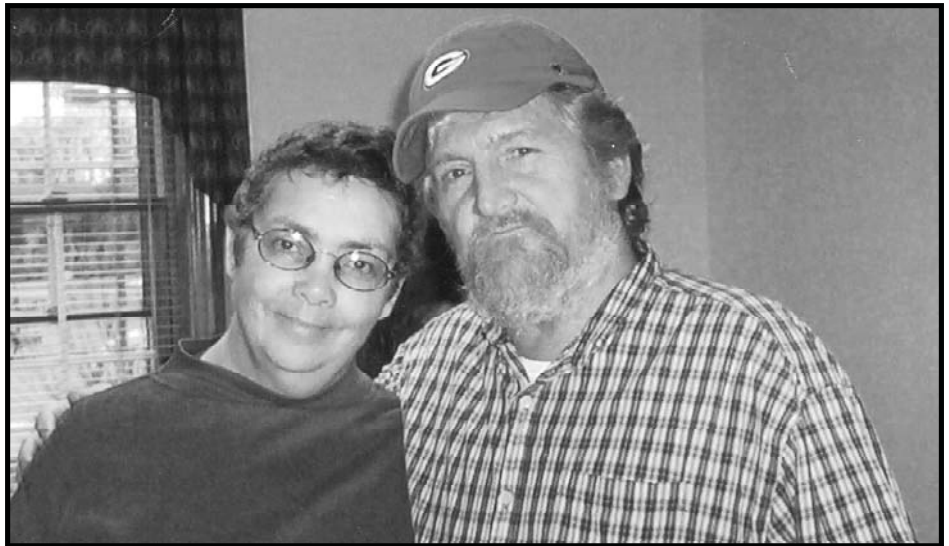

Past guests are now volunteers

Every other weekend, it's all about giving back for Sue and Bob Trossen of Pound, Wis., as they leave their life in the country and travel the hour-plus to the big city to volunteer at the Altrusa House.

They've always done everything together, these parents of two daughters and grandparents of six.

And so it was when they first arrived at the Altrusa House in July 2006 as guests.

Sue had been diagnosed with breast cancer and the Trossens were guests for over eight weeks during her daily radiation treatments. During that time they began making suppers at the Altrusa House, inviting fellow guests to break bread with them.

"And we're still friends," said Sue.

One day they learned the staff was short of volunteers. "So we said we'd do it," said Bob.

Twenty days after his wife completed her treatments, Bob underwent heart bypass surgery – something he had put off until Sue's treatments were over. It went well and later that fall they returned to the Altrusa House as volunteers.

What are their volunteer weekends like? They check guests in, sometimes clean rooms and usually Sue, who worked as a nursing assistant for 20 years, makes home-cooked suppers. And there are smiles, tears and hugs. "It's so rewarding," said Sue as she speaks about the fascinating people she's met.

Hospitals, Altrusa House make great partners

Home is 70 miles away but your treatment for cancer is tomorrow and the next day and the day after that... Your baby arrived prematurely in Iron Mountain, Mich., and had to be flown by air ambulance to St. Vincent Hospital's Newborn Intensive Care Unit (NICU) in Green Bay where she will need care for weeks...Dad had a farm accident in Sheboygan and needs extensive orthopedic surgery followed by rehab.

In the midst of that bad news, the case workers at St. Vincent Hospital have some good news to temper the unexpected turns that life has taken for your family. It's called the Altrusa House.

They find their way to the safe environment of the Altrusa House through referrals from case managers and psychotherapists. Tom Bekkers, a psychotherapist at St. Vincent, said the criteria for a referral is that the lodger must live at least 50 miles from the hospital, have a financial need for the free accommodations and have someone in the hospital or need the care provided at the hospital themselves.

"With high gas prices and the time it takes to go back and forth to home, those things can add significant hardship," Bekkers said.

His involvement comes most often when patients who live a distance from the hospital need frequent outpatient treatment, particularly those receiving radiation therapy for cancer treatment.

"Altrusa House has been a blessing to be able to offer folks who have five or six weeks of radiation therapy every day," Bekkers said. "They can go home on the weekends and then come back on Monday."

Most of those who stay at Altrusa House can't afford to pay the charges that a hotel requires. If they can pay a donation at Altrusa House, that's fine, but if they aren't able to, the work of volunteers and other donors helps defray expenses. "People are so appreciative," Bekkers noted. "It's one less stressor to have to deal with, almost like a Ronald McDonald House."

Lori Weaver, a case manager, said she views Altrusa House as a "safe, caring and socially interactive environment" for the people she refers there. They may include oncology patients, adults or children from out of town who have an early surgery the next morning and families with a patient in the Intensive Care Unit. They may gather at mealtimes, watch TV together or

share stories of their hospital experiences, all comforts when they're alone in an unfamiliar city.

A single room may be occupied by two guests and children must be at least 10 years old if they aren't patients and accompanied by a parent or guardian. They may be younger if they are a hospital patient.

Another case manager, Melissa Thayse, deals with families who have babies in St. Vincent's Newborn Intensive Care Unit.

"Some babies are here three days, some three months," Thayse said. "Babies born at 23 or 24 weeks' gestation stay to their due date at 40 weeks and it's hard for their parents to leave them here. The babies need to bond with their parents and if they're preemies, they may go home on special equipment. Their parents need to be able to take care of the babies and they need to show us that they can use the equipment at home."

The feedback she gets from families who use Altrusa House is always positive. "I've heard from so many parents that the staff is wonderful there and treats them like family," Thayse said. "They feel so fortunate to have a place to stay with such a supportive environment."

After a long day at the hospital, whether as a patient or a patient supporter, coming back to Altrusa House is truly a comforting "home away from home."

'Come as strangers, leave as friends'

Cheri Corcoran, executive director of the Altrusa House, says people are so appreciative of this home away from home for people coping with the emergency medical situations of loved ones or their very own medical challenges.

The 12-bedroom Altrusa House, 1116 E. Mason St., Green Bay, is available to guests at no charge as the result of referrals made by area hospitals. Guests must be from a minimum of 50 miles away from Green Bay to be eligible.

"Our biggest thing," said Corcoran, "you come as strangers and leave as friends."

Some guests are here for one day, others for months at a time. Right now, there are guests who have been at the Altrusa House since July. If they had to stay at a hotel in order to be here for their loved one, well, it just wouldn't be possible financially, she continued.

"People just say it's so comfortable here because they can come back and talk to people because it was a home situation," she said.

She described this past summer as "horrific" because of the numerous car accidents that brought guests here. Volunteers often make the difference, she continued, noting that one of them, Shannon, now 28, was in a serious car accident years ago. "That's why she's here, because she wants to give back," said Corcoran.

"It's amazing how she was an asset to talk to these parents because she's been through the same thing," said Corcoran.

And overnight volunteer Lori Beirl, who is also president of the Altrusa House, makes such a difference, said Corcoran. Guests "can't wait until she comes in. She'll stay in and talk to them all night."

"I always tell my volunteers.... the number one thing about this house is your heart and the guests," continued Corcoran. Guests say "that we're angels here, that they don't know what they would have done without us."

What is the Altrusa House?

The Altrusa House at 1116 E. Mason St. in Green Bay is a 12-bedroom "home away from home" built with the express purpose as a place where people can enjoy temporary accommodations because of necessary medical treatments or because they need to be with a friend or family member in order to lend moral support during a medical crisis. Guests generally live 50 miles or farther away from Green Bay.

And all of this is accomplished at *no charge* thanks to generous donations from people like you.

The Altrusa House was dedicated on a very memorable autumn day Oct. 3, 2001, after years of planning by the Altrusa Club of Green Bay, the local chapter of the international service organization.

The Altrusa Club's first Altrusa House was actually a three-bedroom home owned by St. Vincent Hospital. The club operated the home beginning in the late 1980's.

But it didn't take long for the Altrusa Club of Green Bay to realize that it had to think bigger. We saw the need firsthand, and with the financial support of individuals, businesses and charitable organizations, the dream of the Altrusa House became a reality.

Guests at the Altrusa House are referred by St. Vincent and Bellin Hospitals, both within walking distance of the home, as well as St. Mary's Hospital Medical Center and Aurora Medical Center as well.

The Altrusa House features 12 bedrooms - each lovingly decorated by sponsors - plus a first-level living room, full kitchen and laundry room. There is also a spacious living area on the second level, with kitchenette.

Guests find the home a place of not only refreshing rest, but also "a home away from home" where they can always find a newfound friend to talk with.
